Q: Why is PostgreSQL good?

- PostgreSQL is open source
- You can download PostgreSQL for free
- You can use it without restriction
- Nobody makes any money by selling it
- Nobody can afford to pay developers to improve it
- Many people think FREE == POOR QUALITY
- "You get what you pay for"

Free, as in Communication

- Freedom to communicate
- Freedom to work together
- Freedom to create something more than the work of one person

– Most open source projects are just one person

A: Why is PostgreSQL good?

- Worldwide contribution
- Open to new ideas (eventually!)
- Open to the best ideas (eventually)
- Open Engineering
- Steady progress

Economics of PostgreSQL

- The economic model is different and so it is important that people that make money from using PostgreSQL feed that back into community activity
- Understand the lesson of **heartbleed**:

OpenSSL – used by everybody, supported by nobody

- It is a well understood problem, across many different fields of human activity. In ecology this was called "The Tragedy of the Commons"
- User choice is important: support companies that **actively** support PostgreSQL
